Place small appliances in a transparent or translucent bag (45 L or less) and dispose of them as recyclables at a "recycling station" once a month.

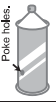

Recyclables

Collection days vary by area, so please confirm the collection day.
Please place recyclables in the "recycling station".

Paper and fibers (Collected once a month) *On rainy days, please try to prevent paper from getting wet.	Newspaper Includes folded flyers Gather into bundles that can be carried by one hand, then strap them crosswise.	Paper pack - After washing and drying, cut open and strap crosswise. - Place paper cartons such as those used for liquor or juice, <u>which have aluminum lining, into the burnable garbage</u> - Please use the recyclable refuse collection boxes available at places such as supermarkets as well.	Cardboard boxes Choose only those with corrugated material between layers, fold and strap crosswise. Remove gum tape, styrofoam, and metal materials.
	Magazines, miscellaneous paper Magazines, old books, catalogs, envelopes, wrapping paper, paper bags, paper boxes, office paper, notebooks, postcards, posters, etc. - Gather into bundles that can be carried by one hand, strap them crosswise. - Do not place these items in bags. - Please shredded paper in the burnable garbage.		Fabrics Old fabrics (sheets, towels, handkerchiefs), old clothing (suits, sweaters, skirts, shirts and pants, etc. Items with zippers and buttons attached are accepted.) - Wash and dry well before placing in <u>transparent or semi-transparent bag</u>. - Curtains, blankets and futons are non-burnable garbage (if they do not fit in bags, they are bulk waste). - Coats are non-burnable garbage; jumpers are burnable garbage. - Please also use recycle shops, etc.

Bottles, cans, PET bottles, dry-cell batteries, spray cans, lighters (Collected once a month)	Bottles (clear, brown, other colors) This refers to bottles that contain things that can be consumed, such as food and drinks, as well as <u>bottles for cosmetics</u> .  - Drain all content, clean the bottles and place them in the "clear", "brown" or "other colors" container, whichever is appropriate. - Please have the retailer collect beer bottles and 1.8 liter bottles of sake as much as possible. - Remove caps of bottles. (Place metal caps in the non-burnable garbage and plastic caps in the burnable garbage.) - If the ring around the neck cannot be removed, please leave it as it is. - Place milk-colored cosmetic bottles, glass dishes (cups, etc.) and broken bottles in the non-burnable garbage.	PET Bottles  - Bottles displaying the PET mark on their label (such as those of soft drinks, dairy and alcohol beverages, soy sauce products, rice wine products, vinegar, condiments, dressings, etc.) can be disposed of as PET bottles. - If the ring around the neck cannot be removed, please leave it as it is. - Remove caps and labels, and place them in the burnable garbage. - Please also use the recyclable garbage collection boxes available at civic centers and supermarkets.	Dry-cell batteries  - Cover the battery electrodes with tape before disposing of dry-cell batteries. Spray cans (including cassette gas tanks) - In order to avoid fires, poke holes in spray cans and cassette gas tanks after using all of the product, then place them in the spray can recyclables basket.  Lighters - Please put into the special lighter collection box placed at the recycling stations. - Only put in completely used-up lighters. - If the gas will not empty out, please take it to the Iga Nambu Clean Center or the Environmental Action room on the 1st floor of the town hall.
	Cans (aluminum and steel cans) - Rinse the insides lightly with water. - Please place aluminum and steel cans in the basket marked "缶類" (Cans). - The metal caps and lids of cans are non-burnable garbage.		

Small appliances (Collected once a month)	Small appliances Various small appliances including digital cameras, phones, game instruments, battery-operated toys  - Place them in a transparent or translucent bag (45 L or less) and dispose of them at a "recycling station". - Dispose of small appliances that cannot be put in the specified bag as bulk waste. <u>Remove dry-cell batteries from small appliances and dispose of them in the "dry-cell batteries" basket.</u> - Delete data including personal information. - The small appliances covered by the Home Appliance Recycling Law are not collected.
	★ You can dispose of the small appliances in the collection boxes located at City Hall and civic centers. • <u>Household appliances (electronic devices) that can fit through the 40 cm x 18 cm slot without disassembling</u> 

Used Cooking Oil / Thermometers (Medical and Regular) / Fluorescent Light Tubes / Metals (Collected once every three months)	Used Cooking Oil (Collected in April and July) - Dispose into container for waste cooking oil. - Pour carefully, avoiding spillage around the container area. - This refers to only edible oil. 	Thermometers (Medical and Regular), Fluorescent Light Tubes, Light Bulbs (Collected in May and August)  - Dispose of them unbroken. Limited to medical and regular thermometers which use mercury indicators. - Alcohol and digital thermometers are disposed with "Non-burnable garbage." - Battery-operated thermometers go in with "small appliances". - Dispose of thermometers (Medical and Regular), fluorescent Light Tubes, and light bulbs together in one basket. * You may place them in their original packaging when you dispose of them to prevent breakage.
		Metals (Collected in June and September)  Only small commercialized metal appliances are included here; large ones go in "bulk waste".

• On the "Nabari City Official LINE", you can search for how to dispose of your garbage, and if you register your address, you will be notified of the collection dates in your area. It is very convenient, so please add us as a friend.



- Tie the top of the refuse bag shut, make sure it is light enough to be carried with one hand, and take it out.

- Hoses must be cut into pieces no longer than 1 m in length.
- Cans of engine oil and paint must be drained and the caps must be removed.
- Fragments or broken pieces, needles, sharp-edged objects, etc. such as sheet glass, cups and others must be wrapped in paper and put out in bags designated as "Kiken (dangerous)".
- Only for umbrellas, cleaning tools (brooms, mops, etc.), long items are placed in the 45 liter designated garbage bags and may be collected even if they stick out of the bag.
- Small appliances go in "recyclables".

Iga Nambu Clean Center (Okugano, Iga City)	Acceptance Hours: 8:30 AM-Noon, 1-4:30 PM A delivery processing fee (120 yen/10kg.) is required. However, refuse in a Designated Refuse Bag, bulk waste with an Bulk Waste Processing Ticket (200 yen/ticket) and recyclable refuse are exempt. Before delivery, cut branches to 1 m or less in length and 10 cm or less in thickness. Only trees and grass from households are accepted. * Garbage that is not sorted will not be accepted.
